Eight Men and Woman Taken in Week by Cam- paign in Congested Areas

Eight men and a woman were arrested, twelve stills confiscated and 3,750 gallons of mash destroyed by police between Monday and Friday, Chief McRell announced today. It was the second week of a campaign against stills in congested districts of the Fourth Precinct.

By use of two firemen and two health inspectors, access was gained to tenements on the pretext of seeking out fire hazards and health violations. Chief McRell said the campaign would be continued next week.

David Tischler and his wife Sadie of 176 West Kinney street were arrested in their home with three men held as material witnesses. Mr. and Mrs. Tischler were held in \$1,000 bail each for the grand jury on a charge of violating the Hobart act. The witnesses, George Poeltl, Henry Robinson, colored, and Edward Haynes, colored, were held in \$100 bail each.

Other prisoners were Walter Lampkin, colored, 92 Prince street; Alphonse Whitfield, colored, 174 Spruce street, and John and Richard Dixon, both colored, 157 Charlton street. In six places where stills were seized, no one was found on the premises.

When Judge McCarthy dismissed the case he gave police a court order to destroy the contents of the barrels. Re
