

Record Day For Dry Fines

**Seventy-four Plead Guilty
and \$16,895 Is
Levied**

A record of \$16,895 in fines from alleged violators of the liquor laws was established yesterday in Federal Court when Judge Fake levied that sum on seventy-four who pleaded guilty.

Three of the men were given prison sentences on charges of second violations. As a result of a previous conviction in 1925, Tony Urba of Elizabeth was sent to the Hudson County jail for six months and fined \$100 when he pleaded guilty to selling liquor in his saloon at 232 Front street, Elizabeth, last November.

When it was brought to Judge Fake's attention by Assistant United States Attorney Hicks that James Hoyt of 301 Waverly avenue was fined \$300 by former Federal Judge Lynch in 1925, Hoyt was sentenced to thirty days in jail in addition to a fine of \$200. Betho Trench, Hoyt's bartender, was let off with a fine of \$25.

Edward McDonald of Paterson, who pleaded guilty to two liquor selling violations, one at 175 Oliver street, Paterson, March 26, and also at 60 Jersey avenue, that city, April 11, was sent to jail for ten days and fined \$100.

Women Fined.

Two women, Mrs. Inger Boysen of Old Bridge, Middlesex County, and her waitress, Marie Pado, were among those fined. They were assessed \$75 and \$25 respectively.

The highest fines during the day were registered against Thomas Dowd of West Orange and his brother-in-law, A. E. Young, who were ordered to pay \$750 each. Both pleaded guilty to three

counts of possessing liquor. The charges resulted from the 1927 raid by prohibition agents on the old Orange Brewery, 119 Hill street, Orange.
