
Poulson's Successor Will Seek New "Human Interest" Angle

Rev. James K. Shields, former superintendent of the Anti-Saloon League of New Jersey, was returned to that office last night. The headquarters committee chose him to succeed Rev. Marna S. Poulson, who resigned several weeks ago. Mr. Poulson succeeded Mr. Shields in 1924. Mr. Shields lives at 41 Park road, Maplewood.

The development of "the human interest phase" in the league work will be stressed. Mr. Shields, known from his previous incumbency as a militant dry, said in a formal statement.

"I told the committee it was rather an unusual compliment in that I had previously served them eleven years," Mr. Shields said. "The task today is more difficult than it was sixteen years ago when I came to New Jersey. At that time saloons were everywhere in evidence and the issue had a kick in it that created human interest more readily than the situation does today. Nevertheless, organized temperance sentiment is more feared than the minions of the law by the wet opposition."
