Dry Kaids Net A Still a Day

A still a day was the average set up
by the federal prohibition department
in this state during the year, according
to records made public today by
Deputy Prohibition Administrator
Lewis J. Tutt.

The total capacity of the 365 stills thich ranged from one gallon to 50,000 gallons was 745,570 gallons. Four hundred and seventy-one automobiles were confiscated and one river barge, the home of a speakeasy, was seized. One thousand six hundred and twenty-four persons were arrested and about 1,000 necessaries raided.

The year's seizures included a halfmillion gallons of alcohol, more than two and one-half million gallons of u mash and 884,202 gallons of beer.

Beer Bottling Plant Seized by Dry Mer

A beer bottling plant was seized by stederal prohibition agents late yesterday in a garage in the rear of 122 Hill patreet, Orange. No arrests were made. In addition to the equipment for bottling beer the agents seized forty cases and five half-barrels of beer.

Other agents raided the Little White House Grill at 1480 Broad street, Bloomfield, and seized a quantity of wine, whisky and beer. They arrested Nathan Berkowitz of 29 Stratford place, Newark. He was held in bail of \$2,500 when arraigned today before United States Commissioner Joseph F. Holland.

A small truck, loaded with three half-barrels of beer, was seized in front of 436 Lafayette street, Newark, and Joseph Lubis of 252 Ferry street, Newark, seph Lubis of 252 Ferry street, Newark, are steed. He was held in bail of \$1,000 by the commissioner.

The Crystal Spring Club of 2 Market street, East Paterson, also was raided and Nicholas Enhofer of that address arrested. The agents seized two half-barrels of beer. Enhofer will be arraigned today before the commissioner.
