1934

Latest issues of local newspapers and also a copy of the centennial edition of the Newark Star-Eagle; a photo of the old Postoffice building; two photos of the present building; a sketch of the new building; a copy of the invitation; a copy of the program; copies of speeches by Postmaster General Farley, Governor Moore and Mayor Ellenstein.

Also, minted 1934 coins of one, five, ten, twenty-five and fifty cents and a \$1 bill and the 1934 issue of the World Almanac.
