

ANOTHER ARREST IN LIQUOR DRIVE

U. S. Agents Nab Mogul—He
Is Held in Bail with

Another arrest was made today by Chief Deputy United States Marshal Woodbury B. Snowden in the dragnet set by Federal authorities for dry law violators in connection with the liquor investigation being conducted here.

Abe Mogul, of 139 Cooper Street, was arrested on a charge of illegal possession and transportation and subsequently was held under \$5,000 bail for the U. S. Grand Jury's action when he waived a hearing.

This is the second "important arrest" in as many days in connection with the drive on alleged bootleggers in Trenton, Nathan Aroniss, former proprietor of the Bismarck Cafe, Hanover Street, having been nabbed yesterday and held in \$7,500 bail for the Federal Grand Jury on an illegal possession and transportation charge.

Mogul, whose arrest followed today, was connected by the authorities with the seizure last Wednesday of a truck loaded with 110 cases of alleged liquor, by Patrolman Thomas Jones, at North Clinton Avenue and Ott Street. It was determined at that time that the truck was registered in Mogul's name.

Both defendants furnished bail bond for their release. The Federal authorities refuse to disclose any detailed information as to the circumstances connected with the arrests of Aroniss and Mogul, beyond stating that they were made in a general cleanup to get at the source of the liquor supply in this vicinity.

Two more Trentonians were apprehended yesterday on a warrant for arrest as dry law violators in the liquor investigation being conducted here by Federal authorities.

Philip Levine, whose address was given as 118 Lee Avenue, surrendered himself at the office of United States Commissioner Wilson here, after notice from Chief United States Deputy Marshal Snowden. As Commissioner Wilson was not at his office when Levine arrived, he was not arraigned, but is expected to return, probably today, for the hearing.

Abe Mogul, of 139 Cooper Street, named in the same warrant with Levine, according to the authorities, was arrested yesterday by Snowden, charged with illegal transportation and possession of liquor, and was placed under \$5,000 bail for Federal Grand Jury action by Commissioner Wilson.

Authorities connected Mogul and Levine with the seizure last Wednesday of a truck loaded with 110 cases of alleged liquor, by Patrolman Thomas Jones, at North Clinton Avenue and Ott Street. It was determined at that time that the truck was registered in Mogul's name.

Yesterday's captures made a total of three in two days in the Government's drive against alleged bootleggers here, but details of the cases were not made public by the authorities except to say they planned a general clean-up to reach the source of liquor supply in this district.

On Tuesday, Nathan Aroniss, of Bryn Mawr and Stuyvesant Avenues, former proprietor of the Bismarck Cafe, on East Hanover Street, was nabbed by Snowden's aides and placed under \$7,500 bond by Commissioner Wilson on charges of illegal transportation and possession of liquor.
